Stratford-upon-Avon

Immerse yourself in all things Shakespeare. Stratford-upon-Avon, home to the greatest playwright of our time, William Shakespeare is also home to the RSC, the internationally renowned theatre company.

Pay a visit to one or both of the two world famous theatres in the heart of the town.



The Swan Theatre is a favourite space for many actors, directors and audiences. An intimate theatre, it seats approximately 450 people on three sides of a deep thrust stage. Situated on Waterside, alongside the River Avon, the Royal Shakespeare Theatre is the main 1,040 seat thrust stage auditorium. It re-opened in November 2010 following a three-year transformation project. It is a Grade II listed building and retains many of the art deco features of the 1932 Shakespeare Memorial Theatre.

Learn more about the history of the theatre by taking a Theatre tour. Discover the public and private areas of the theatre. Learn about the origins of the RSC and its theatres in Stratford-upon-Avon and explore a production in more depth to learn about the theatre making process. Alternatively take in one of the many ever changing exhibitions ranging from costume design to set design to family focused interactive exhibitions.

Performing various shows by Shakespeare, his contemporaries and modern playwrights throughout the year, a trip to see a show by the RSC is a must-do for all visitors to Shakespeare's England.

A trip to Shakespeare's England would not be complete without a visit to Shakespeare's Birthplace or one of the other 4 historic houses in the area, Anne Hathaway's Cottage and Gardens, Nash's House and New Place, Mary Arden's Farm and Hall's Croft.



Become part of the Shakespeare story at Shakespeare's Birthplace which is the perfect introduction to William Shakespeare's Works, Life and Times. Fall in love with the childhood home of Shakespeare's wife at the most romantic Shakespeare house, Anne Hathaway's Cottage. Discover the sights, sounds and smells of an authentic Tudor farm at Mary Arden's Farm and explore the elegant Jacobean home of Shakespeare's daughter Susanna Shakespeare and her husband Dr John Hall at Hall's Croft. Finally conclude your journey at the site of Shakespeare's final home in Stratford-upon-Avon, Nash's House and New Place.

A range of events and activities take place throughout the year and costumed actors interpret the spaces around them to bring the historic homes to life, creating a truly memorable must-see experience for visitors.
